

Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Council
held at the Social Club Broadfield
on Monday the 1st February at 8pm.
Present: Mr A L Hensome (Chairman)
Messrs. Bottsford Greenwood Denmore
and Brown.

Apologies were received from Miss Bacon
and the Clerk.

Motion 1 In the absence of the Clerk Mr. Brown
acted as Secretary

Motion 2 As the minute book had not arrived
the confirmation of the minutes of the last
meeting was deferred.

Motion 3 Broadfield-Dancey Bus Service Mr.
Saffles local manager of the Bus Company
attended. The Clerk advised that
the Pacific Transporters had submitted
the new timetable change their Line
take effect from 8th February 1954
from the existing "experimental" one to one
originally sanctioned in 1953 by the
Commissioners and which appears in
their license. But which is fact not
operated: It was also reported to the
meeting that very shortly the Pacific
Transporters would consider an
application by the Company for a revised
schedule. It was not however clear
what exactly this revised schedule
would be. Mr. Saffles thought it would
be the same as the existing experimental
service but in the absence of the actual
correspondence the point could not be cleared up.

It was agreed however that the official schedule as on the Licence was not suitable particularly as it omitted the 4.15 Roaney to Bradfield bus for the Schoolchildren. The council therefore decided to ask the Clerk to the Canal District Council to request the Lower Commissioners to allow the existing "experimental" service to continue pending their decision on the Company's latest application. W Brown agreed to see W Lanner on the next day.

4 W Staples then put forward confidentially certain of his own ideas for the improvement of the service. These proposals made no substantial alteration in the existing experimental service and the council agreed they were suitable. Some doubts however were expressed because W Stiff's earlier remarks about the desperate nature of the economics of the service seemed hardly consistent with his proposals to continue to operate the experimental service practically unchanged.

The Chairman thanked W Staples for his attendance. W Staples then withdrew

Housing 5.
Allocation

The Acting Clerk read a letter from W Stiff protesting against the recent allocation of eight new Bradfield Council houses. It was agreed that as the Parish Council was not the Housing Authority it would take no action.

Post Box 6. Proposed Letter Box at the W.I. Hut. A letter from the Balmain Council was read by the Council. This letter explained that the W.I. hut was too near the Post Office Box to justify the erection of a new box there. It suggested the removal of the Bowring Street Box to the W.I. Hut as an alternative. The Council considered that owing to the remoteness of Bowring Green it would be a hardship to move the box particularly as the Lower Street Box which would in this event be the nearest box was in a direction away from shop, buses and any other amenities. The Council considered that a. 27 houses would benefit substantially by a box at the W.I. Hut this should justify reconsideration by the Head Balmain of his decision. The average distance the inhabitants of these 27 houses had to walk to post a letter is about 650 yards & a round trip of about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. The proposed new box would at least halve this distance. In view of the number of houses involved the proposal seemed to the Council very reasonable and it was decided to ask the L.S.B. to take up the matter again.

War Memorial Boxes 7. War Memorial boxes were mentioned. It was reported that the Black Council was willing to remove a small part of the War Memorial fence so as to improve the line of sight on the corner provided that Watford would also cut back his hedge.

It was agreed that the black should take the hedge up until the highway boundary
