The Chairman read a letter he had received from the Chairman of the District Council with reference to setting up a fund for necessitous cases and gave his views thereon. Considerable discussion took place and Mr. Brown undertook to find out if any concrete cases had been reported.

Par Service

The Clerk reported the introduction of a new Bus Service to Southampton from Basingstoke and suggested amendments in the Braintree Service in order to make connections with the Basingstoke Southampton Services. He further reported that with Mr. Brown they had met the Traffic Superintendent who explained the revised timetable. It

was agreed the suggested timetable appeared to be satisfactory and the Clerk was directed to write to the Company stating the Council supported the new suggestions.

Speed Limit. The Clerk read a letter from the Deputy County Surveyor that as a development was scattered there was no justification for the imposition of a 30 mph speed limit.

Lottery Act. Receipt of a letter from the County & T RDB with memorandum describing the terms provisions of the Small Lotteries & Gaming Act 1956.

Management of Playingfield. After discussion it was agreed that no special action be taken with regard to the Recreation Ground and that the Management should continue as previously when it was vested in the private Trustees.

Roads. The Chairman remarked on the general condition of the roads in the Parish and the Clerk was asked to report the matter to the Devisional Surveyor and ask him to make a survey.

Planning. Mr Brown produced a plan of development of part of Pagn Way Farm for gravel extraction. On the proposal of Mr Parsons seconded by Mr Greenwood the Clerk was directed to lodge an objection with the District Council to the proposal on the ground that it would spoil the amenity.
