- (a) The Clerk reported that he was  
trying to negotiate an increased  
rent for the use of the  
recreation ground by the School.
- (b) The Clerk read a letter from  
Mr. Atlee regarding the Blaisfield  
& District Horticultural Society.  
Apparently there were two  
signatories & the other was a  
Mr. A.E. Davis. Mr. Parsons &  
Mr. Cobbold thought it might  
be the Mr. Davis from the  
~~dog & crook~~ <sup>Wheatfield</sup>. He had died  
some while ago. The Clerk  
said he would inform Mr. Atlee.
- (c) The Clerk read letters from the  
Hampshire & Isle of Wight  
Playing Fields Association & the

Association of Parish Councils regarding the new dressing rooms. The Council were concerned about the obligations on the Council should be football clubs go defunct. It is decided that the whole question of the dressing rooms should stand over until the football clubs made some approach to the Council.
