### Letters Arising

- (a) The Clerk reported that the rent  
of the Recreation Ground had been  
increased to £80 as from  
September 1970.
- (b) The Clerk reported that a sum  
of £49.12 had now been paid to  
the Romsey Hospital being the net  
proceeds of the defunct Blaishfield  
& District Horticultural Society.
- (c) It was reported that the W.I.  
seats had been erected.
- (d) The Clerk reported that he  
had not heard from Mr. Bennett  
& that he would write again.  
He was also instructed to find out  
when the footpath was to be  
finished & when the ponds were  
to be cleaned out.

## Recreation Ground

The matter of the new dressing rooms is to stand over until the football clubs approach the Council.

## Any Other Business

- (1) Mr. Lowman brought up the question of overgrown footpaths. It was decided to leave the question until the annual meeting. The position is that since they are rarely used they quickly become overgrown.
- (2) The Clerk was instructed to find out if the footpath was still open through the Wheatsheaf.
- (3) The Clerk was instructed to write to the County Land agent & find out when the footpath signs would be arriving.
- (4) It was reported that Mr. K. Foreman was to appeal over the refusal of planning permission for a store adjacent to the Chapel Works. The Council were most concerned that this light industry would gradually spread. Mr. Cobbold said that the use should be restricted to a store only. The Council decided to take no action.
- (5) The Council were alarmed at the noise that arose at a 'dance' at the Wheatsheaf recently. It was decided to leave it until the Musciano

occurred again.

- (b) It was reported that a hedge was overgrown near the Dog & Crook making it very difficult for pedestrians to use the footway. The Clerk was instructed to ask the owner to cut it back.

Next meeting was fixed for Monday 25<sup>th</sup> October, at 8 p.m.

There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting.
