2) Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 2nd July 1973 were  
read and allowed.

Matters Arising.

(i) The Clerk produced photographs taken by the  
Sunday Mirror of the cars at Fair Wishes. It was  
decided to send copies of these to the R.D.C. so that  
they could take the necessary action.

(ii) It was decided that the fence damaged  
at the Resolva Ground in an accident should be  
repaired. The Clerk said he would continue to  
try and obtain payment from the Hayes & his  
insurers.

(iii) The Clerk reported that he had not heard  
from Mr Bennett regarding the salivence outside  
the w.c. It was reported that one hole had  
been filled in, but that another had appeared. The  
Clerk said he would try and get the matter  
resolved.

Compendence.

(i) The Clerk reported that he had received some  
handrails and notices from British Rail advertising  
Salisbury-Poole line. The Council decided that  
these should be erected.

(ii) The clerk told the Council that he had heard from the clerk of the R.D.C. that Parish Councils would be notified of all planning applications in their parishes and that the Council were deciding how best to do this.

(iii) The clerk reported that he had received two letters from Mrs. Shitt. The first - a copy letter to the Divisional Surveyor asking for permission to dig two holes on behalf of the Bramfield team, on the roadside hedge outside the W.I. The second was a letter informing him that the permission had been refused. The Council considered the decision of the Surveyor and the clerk was instructed to write to Mrs. Shitt asking her to get in touch with the Council with a view to planting them on the W.I. side of the hedge.

(iv) A letter from the H.C.E. Surveyor informing the Council that the width restrictions were to be reviewed and asking for opinions from the Parishes. The Council decided to suggest that all existing restrictions would be continued in force and also the road to Folley should be included.

(v) The Annual report of the Medical Officer of Health for the R.D.C. was circulated.

### 5. The Football Club Proposed Pavilion.

The clerk read a long letter from the 250+ club regarding the possibility of erecting a pavilion on the Recreation Ground see p. 4. In short the 250+ Club pavilion would cost about £5276.72. The site would be 60'10" x 22'00 and would be made of cedar wood.

The Club asked the Council to:- (in brief)

request a licence to erect the pavilion to

(w) <sup>agreed.</sup> activities for Planning Council.

(v) <sup>agreed.</sup> activities for grant & loan from the Low P.F.A.

(d) <sup>agreed.</sup> donation of £407 to the club so that the R.D.C. can do the same

(e) <sup>agreed.</sup> subsidises the buildings so that V.A.T. can be avoided.

— agreed subject to the legality of such a move.

The Council would not charge an establish a charge for election.

The Council also decided that the existing brick block building should be retained within 24 months of the completion of the new building. The club was instructed to find out what access was required and it was suggested that no car parking be allowed near the pavilion.

The library should be available for use by other people or societies in the village possibly at a discount. The Council would require undertaking regarding maintenance, insurance and repairs. The football club would be expected to pay all running costs. The Building would become the property of the Parish Council should be not be used for ~~defect~~ with the right to sell or remove the building. The Council would charge a rent if it thought it necessary. The Council also suggested that fees should be charged for school dinners, which were proposed. The Council decided that they would not be in favour of a licence to sell liquor at the Pavilion.

## 6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- 1) It was reported that the Footpath 12 was blocked up. The Clerk was asked to deal with this.
- 2) The Chairman mentioned that a hedge in a field outside his house was always overhanging. The Clerk was asked to release the valves concerned.
- 3) The Clerk was asked to ask the Bennett to fix the wheels on the wheel along the new road works which were very high as a matter of urgency. It was also instructed to find out what the works were to be completed.

14/ The Council resolved to increase the Clerk's salary to \$60 per annum back dated to 1st April 1973. The Clerk left the room whilst the matter was under consideration.

There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting.
