

Minutes of the meeting of Braisfield Parish Council held on Monday 9th March 1974 at the Womens Institute at 7:30pm.

Present: Mr C.H. Boulton, in the Chair, Miss D.C.L. Bacon and Messrs Poulton, Lawman & G.R.B. Brown.

Resolutions: were received from Mrs. B.M. Bell, Mrs. M. Freeman & J. Skene.

2) Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 7th January were read and approved.

3) Matters Arising: (i) It was reported that the litter bin had been erected by School Board and that the account had been settled.
(ii) It was decided to ask Mr. Nettlethorpe and Mr. Ollivier if they could trim the hedges on either side of Footpath No 9. It was also decided to place marks at either end to show the houses and houses using the track.
(iii) Mr. Clark reported that the footpath signs would be put up before the end of the month.

4) Correspondence: (i) Mr. Clark read a letter from Lord Leasing asking for private donations to the fund for Mr. Greenlade the retiring secretary of the Hambleton Association of Parish Councils.
(ii) Various circulars from the Parish Council's Association were read.
(iii) A letter from the post office was read informing the Council that the litter bin box in Pagans Way Road had been moved to the outside of the Manor.
(iv) It was decided not to seek the Hambleton

Best Keler Village, Comberkirk.

- (v) The Clerk read a letter from the Teak Valley District Council about sewage. Mr Bacon told the meeting that a scheme had been ~~discussed~~ presented to the Public Health Committee.
- (vi) The Clerk reported that the charge for grass mowing, the Recreation Ground had been increased to £2.85 an hour.

5. The Annual Parish Meeting was discussed. The date was confirmed for Monday 25th March 1974 at the Women's Institute at 8.00 pm.

6. The Pavilion.

- (i) The Clerk reported that both the loan and the grant from the H.K.O.W. P.F.A. had been allowed but that loan sanction from the H.C.C. had not yet been allowed.
- (ii) The Clerk read a letter from Mr J.B.S. Atlee, the Council's solicitor, suggesting in short that the Council own the pavilion and that the 250+ club lease it for three years. The Council accepted the advice regarding ownership but thought that a longer lease, should it be possible, be arranged.
- (iii) The 250+ club had written requesting, if possible, a further grant from Council Funds. The Council decided that this could not be done at the present time.
- (iv) The 250+ club had also approached a loan for £1000 from the Football Association and the Council had previously agreed to act as guarantors.

The Club had requested that they employ the same solicitors as the Council. It was decided that the AGM should decide this.

(v) The 250+ Club sought permission of the Council to hold a fete on the 29th June on the Recreation Ground. Permission was granted subject to the Club making good any damage and clearing up all litter.

7) Finance.

8) Any Other Business.

(i) The Colbold reported that he had attended at the meeting of the Romney & Stockbridge Association of Parish Councils which was a good meeting. The new large part of the office equipment needed in "audou" was "shattering".

- (ii) The Chairman said that rubbish was continually being dumped in Killy Lane. The Clerk was instructed to write to the R.D.C. and ask them to tidy it up.
- (iii) The Clerk was instructed to write to the Builder extending the cottage 'way' and ask him to keep the mud off the Road.
- (iv) The Clerk was asked to ask the Divisical Surveyor to do something about the wedge at Braisfield Lodge which was being damaged, principally by the bus.
- (v) The Clerk was asked to take up the question of outlawing ditches in lawed street.
- (vi) It was decided to ask the Div. Surveyor if anything could be done to prevent cars parking on the road in the square outside the Cunningham's house. It was suggested that perhaps double yellow lines could be put down.
- (vii) It was decided to write to Mr Watkins to ask him to try and keep his vehicles off the road to the north of his house.

There being no further business, the Chairman closed the meeting.
