2) Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 4th March were read and
approved.

3) Matters Arising.

- (i). The Clerk reported that the telephones had
changed this side of Footpath No 9.
- (ii). It was reported that the sewage scheme was
not in the 1974's estimates but was being kept under
review. The programmes had been subject to several
financial reviews.
- (iii). The Clerk reported that the dumping in Kiln
Lane was being attended to, not
- (iv). The Divisional Surveyor had been in contact with
regards to the edge of Braishfield Colney, overlooking
children in Lamp Street or the Yellow Line.

4) Correspondence.

- (i). The Clerk had received a letter from
the Test Valley District Council saying that Parish
Council would receive official planning

- (ii). A request from the T.V.D.C. for information
about derelict land has been received. The

Council decided that there was none in the area.

(iii) The Council decided to not to admit the Maxwell Park horses to be checked.

(iv) A letter from Mr Bennett had been received stating that Mr Morgan in Angerton was to succeed him in the post of Divisional Surveyor.

5. Matters Raised at the Annual Parish Meeting.

(i) The Council noted that concern was expressed about the unkept yellow line in the Square. They decided not to proceed.

(ii) The Council decided to trust the H.C.C. in relation to the continual delay in finishing the road improvement, particularly in relation to the road pricing, reinstatement of kerbs, double yellow lines, resealing the surface and grass cutting. The Clerk was instructed to write and chase the authority for.

(iii) It was requested that no trees were to be planted along the land between the Was Meadow and the garage.

(iv) The Clerk was instructed to write to the Police in Rugeley asking them to check on vehicles of a very heavy nature travelling and parking in the village.

(v) The Clerk was instructed to ask the T.V.S.C. to remove the derelict rubbish behind the old station in the Recreation Ground.

(vi) The Council were unanimously against the motion that a Blaxfield Mead be banned. The matter is to be discussed.

(vii) The Council decided to keep liaison the Sutton Wards Authority for main drainage.

(viii). The Clerk was instructed to write and thank Mr J.R.B. Brown for his very hard work on behalf of the Council.

(ix) The Council were not in favour of council rates in the village.

(x) The Council decided that a footpath generally used be affixed. It was proposed by Mr Bill and seconded by Miss Bacon that Mrs Fally should be nominated.

6) Prolonged Pavilion.

The Clerk informed that the pavilion had and negotiations were proceeding.

7) Day Other Business

(i) The Council unanimously agreed to send a deputation to the Romsey Abbey Abbot.

(ii) It was decided that the Head Master and teacher look after the Council interests on the Romsey and District Accident Prevention Council.

(iii) The Clerk was instructed to write to the Clerk of the Romsey Extra Parish Council and ask him to do something about the holes in Cockhill.
