1) Anthology. None.

2) Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 4th March were read and
approved.

3) Matters Arising.

(i) The Clerk reported that the Melkethwaite had
viewed the side of footpath No 9.

(ii) It was reported that the sewage scheme was
not in the 1974/5 estimates but was being kept under
review. The programmes had been subject to several
financial cut-backs.

(iii) The Clerk reported that the dumping in Kilm
hall was being attended to. ^{not}

(iv) The Divisional Surveyor had been in contact with
regard to the hedge at Braishfield Corner, overlooking
churches in Council Street or the Yellow lines.

4) Remembrance.

(i) The Clerk had received a letter from
the Test Valley District Council saying that Parish
Councils would receive notification of planning
applications. Plans could be considered subsequently.

(ii) A request from the T.V.D.C. for information
about district land had been received. The

Council decided that there was noise in the area.

(iii) The Council resolved ~~to~~ not to admit the Diamond Park works to be executed.

(iv) A letter from the Bennett had been received stating that the Morgan in Ardour was to succeed him in the work of Divisional Engineer.

5. Matters Raised at the Annual Parish Meeting.

(i) The Council noted that concern was expressed about the unpaved yellow lines in the square. They decided not to proceed.

(ii) The Council decided to advise the H.C. in relation to the continual delay in finishing the road improvement, particularly in relation to the road surfacing, reinstatement of eutanas double kerelkare holes, resetting the verges and grass cutting. The Clerk ~~is~~ was instructed to write and chase the authority had.

(iii) It was resolved that no trees were to be blanked ~~along~~ along the land between the road Diamond and the garage.

(iv) The Clerk was instructed to write to the Police in Rouney asking them to check on vehicles of a very heavy nature travelling and loading in the village.

(v) The Clerk was instructed to ask the T.V. S.C. to remove the dumped rubbish behind the old lavation in the recreation ground.

(vi) The Council was unanimously against the resolution that a Braisfield Man be harboured. The matter is to be dropped.

(vii) The Council decided to keep liaising the Southern Water Authority for main drainage.

(viii). The Clerk was instructed to write and thank Mr G.R.B. Brown for his very hard work on behalf of the Council.

(ix) The Council were not in favour of a new Council House in the village.

(x) The Council decided that a footpath, where possible should be allowed. It was proposed by Mr Bell and recorded by Miss Bacon that Mrs Faly should be nominated.

6) Proposed Pavilion.

The Clerk reported that the pavilion plans and negotiations were proceeding.

7) Day Office Business.

(i) The Council unanimously agreed to send a cheque for £50 to the Romney Abbey Appeal.

(ii) It was decided that Mrs Stevan could look after the Council interests on the Romney and District Accident Memorial Council.

(iii). The Clerk was instructed to write to the Clerk of the Romney Extra Parish Council and ask the Council to do something about the footpaths in Crookhill.
