2. Minutes

of the meeting held on Monday 6th May 1974 were read and approved.

3. Matters arising:

The Clerk reported that he had still not received a reply from the Divisional Surveyor. The Clerk was instructed to write to the Surveyor again and point out that the defects were serious and could cause serious accidents. (ii) The Clerk reported that the footpath signs had been erected, but that they were two short.

4. Correspondence.

(iv) The Clerk read a letter from Mrs. Heenan informing the Council that she would not be able to attend meetings on the 1st Monday in the month as she would be at another meeting in a different place. The Council resolved to meet in future on the 2nd Monday in the month.

The Clerk went through the draft licence of the pavilion and in particular the suggested amendments required by the 25'0" Club. The Council decided not to allow the draft licence except where the Club the solicitor acting for the Council had no objection.

### 6. Any other Business.

It was reported that the hedge adjoining the Common Hill Road and the Recreation Ground was very overgrown. It was decided to get this cut by the Ayrman.
