Matters Arising

- (i) The Clerk reported that the H.C.C. would erect a new notice-board in the school playground.
- (ii) The Clerk reported that he had not heard from the Divisional Engineer regarding the bad road surface from the bog and brook and the wheeling and also the verge on the side of Mr. King's house.
