74. PLANNING APPLICATION TVS 4205 - GARAGE - 3 HILLVIEW ROAD, BRAISHFIELD

RESOLVED:

That no objection be raised in respect of Application No. TVS 4205.

75. PUBLIC WORKS LOAN BOARD - REPAYMENT OF LOAN

Pursuant to Minute 57 of 14th November 1983 the Clerk reported that the Public Works Loan Board had advised that it would not be possible to renegotiate the original agreements as suggested by the Parish Council.

76. OVERHANGING HEDGE - FOOTWAY BETWEEN KILN LANE AND THE WHEATSHEAF INN

RESOLVED:

That the Divisional Surveyor be requested to trim the hedge between Kiln Lane and the Wheatsheaf Inn which currently overhangs, and thus partially obstructs, the footway.

77. NEWPORT LANE - SUBSIDENCE

RESOLVED:

That the attention of the Divisional Surveyor be drawn to the problem of subsidence in Newport Lane and requested to take appropriate action.

78. BRAISHFIELD SEWERAGE SCHEME - WATER SUPPLY CONNECTION TO CONTRACTOR'S SITE OFFICE

RESOLVED:

That the attention of the Southern Water Authority be drawn to the subsidence which has occurred in the reinstated trench connecting the water supply to the contractor's site office.

80. VILLAGE POND

The Parish Council considered the contents of a letter from Test Valley Borough Council to the Secretary of the Braishfield Village Association seeking information on the pond scheme.

RESOLVED:

That Test Valley Borough Council be advised that the Parish Council in conjunction with the Braishfield Village Association are still in the process of finalizing certain details relating to the proposed pond refurbishment scheme and that accordingly they would request the Borough Council to carry over any offer of grant aid into the financial year 1984/85.
