MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF BRAISHFIELD PARISH COUNCIL
HELD AT THE VILLAGE HALL, BRAISHFIELD ON 15TH JANUARY, 1987
(7.00 p.m. - 7.50 p.m.)

PRESENT: P. Watkins, I. Chisholm, J. Musselwhite and G. Shipton.

(Apologies for absence were received from Miss P. Saunders and Councillor J. Wyss (Borough Council representative)

## 82. MINUTES.

RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 18th December, 1986 be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

### 83. MATTERS ARISING.

(a) Newport Lane.

The Chairman reported that Councillor Wyss had approached the developer of the land at Chapel Works, Newport Lane who had agreed to improve the situation concerning mud which had been deposited on the highway by vehicles visiting the building site.

(b) Chapel Close.

The Chairman reported that the Borough Council's Housing Department had indicated that they would be prepared to carry out the necessary works to the footway at the entrance to Chapel Close.

(c) Megana Way.

The Chairman reported on the difficulties being experienced by the Borough Council in ascertaining the owner of the mobile home which and been deposited in Megana Way.

## 84. PLANNING APPLICATION.

TVS.5215

Erection of dwelling adjoining the Dog and Crook Public House (outline).

The proposed development be objected to on the grounds that 1) siting of the dwelling at this location would be detrimental to the amenity of the villag and 2) access on to the Braishfield Road at this point would be dangerous.

#### 85. POLL CARDS

The Clerk reported that the Borough Council's Returning Officer had indicated that as a result of a change in the law it would now be possible for him to issue poll cards for separate Parish Council elections. This would only be done on the request of the Parish Council and the estimated cost of the service in respect of Braishfield would be approximately £40.

RESOLVED that the Returning Officer be informed that the Braishfield Parish Council did not consider it necessary for the issue of Parish poll cards for the forthcoming elections.

### 86. BRAISHFIELD CHURCH COUNCIL.

RESOLVED that the statement of accounts of the Braishfield Church Council for 1985/86 be received and that a contribution of £85 be made towards the maintenance of the churchyard in respect of 1986/87.

## 87. FOOTPATHS.

RESOLVED that the occupier of PainsHay Farm be requested to carry out repairs to the broken style on footpath 4 close to the entrance to the woods and the farmhouse.

## 88. HIGHWAYS.

The Chairman referred to a reply which had been received from County Councillor Merrydale concerning the Parish Council's efforts to improve the junction at Jermyns Lane/Sandy Lane/Braishfield Road. Mr. Merridale had indicated that he would support the Parishin their efforts but sought details of the type of improvements that were required. In addition, reference was made to the damaged railings on the eastern si e of Crook Hill opposite the Dog and Crook.

### RESOLVED -

- (1) That the Clerk investigate the criteria for the provision of rumble strips approaching road junctions;
- (2) That further consideration be given to the possible improvements to the junction at the next meeting of the Parish Council; and
- (3) That the Area Surveyor be requested to repair the broken railings as a matter of urgency.

### 89. ANNUAL PARISH MEETING.

RESOLVED that the Annual Parish Meeting be held following the normal meeting of the Parish Council on Tuesday, 14th April at 8.00 p.m. and that County Councillor Merridale be invited to attend the meeting as guest speaker.

### 90. BUS SERVICES.

Reference was made to complaints from users of the Braishfield to Romsey bus service about the journey time for the service. The route to Romsey was currently via Kings Somborne.

RESOLVED that the number of passengers using the service between Braishfield and Romsey be identified before any approach is made to the Bus Company.

## 91. CLERK'S SALARY

RESOLVED that the Clerk's salary be increased to £385 per annum with effect from 1st January 1987.

## 92. PEOPLE AT RISK.

Consideration was given to the establishment of a register of the elderly and people who were at risk living within the Parish. Although there was no immediate problem within Braishfield, the recent exceptionally cold weather conditions had prompted consideration being given to a register of this kind.

RESOLVED that the local general practitioners be requested to identify those residents of Braishfield whom they consider to be at risk and that any information they felt able to give be submitted to Mr. Chisholm.
