RESOLVED -

89. TREE PLANTING

RESOLVED -

That the Parish Council's grateful thanks be extended to M Hoddinott for planting the tree donated by the Test Valley Borough Council on his land opposite the War Memorial.

COUNCIL OFFICES EXTENSION

The Clerk referred to a response from the Borough Council's Chief Executive to the Parish Council's concern at rising costs for the refurbishment works at Test Valley's Duttons Road offices. This explained that the costs were largely the result of unforeseen works revealed once the improvements had commenced.

RESOLVED -

That the Borough Council's Chief Executive be requested for a breakdown on the costs of the works at Duttons Road and the Parish Council's concern be expressed at the ability of the Surveyor who initially carried out the estimates for the work.

91. PLANNING APPLICATION - DWELLING BRAISHFIELD GARAGE 84/2/94

The Clerk referred to the resubmitted application for the above development and to the additional comments made on that application by the Parish Council's Vice-Chairman after consultation with Parish Council members. The Clerk also referred to an objection to the development by a local resident.

RESOLVED -

That the action of the Vice-Chairman in submitting the following additional comments to those already set out in Minute No. 68/12/93 be confirmed.

The Parish Council requests that this particular application be considered by the appropriate planning committee and not by way of the scheme of delegation and;

The Parish Council would also appreciate the Sub Committee viewing the site of this application.

92. VILLAGE POND

Councillor Tim Howkins reported that the contractors had completed the additional work required to the sump adjoining the pond in Church Lane. He also referred to arrangements for the regular cutting of the grass and for the need to cut back and trim shrubs on the landscaped area surrounding the pond.

- Councillor Tim Howkins be authorised to arrange the cutting back of shrubs subject to a maximum cost of £60.

- That the Clerk ascertain the likely costs for the acquisition of a suitable wooden seat for installation at the children's play area.
