15. MINUTES

RESOLVED -

46. PARISH COUNCIL RESIGNATIONS

The Chairman reported the receipt of letters giving notice of resignation from the Parish Council from Councillor Jeremy Musslewhite and Councillor Mrs Rita Stitt. Both had outlined their personal reasons for being unable to continue serving on the Council.

RESOLVED -

That both resignations be accepted with considerable regret and the vacancies declared to the Borough Council's Returning Officer.

SPEED LIMIT

A number of Braishfield residents attended the meeting to comment on Hampshire County Council's proposals for a speed limit in Braishfield and to the Parish Council's observations on their extent. The Chairman closed the Parish Council meeting to allow the residents to make their comments and speak to Parish Council members. The Chairman explained to those present that the Parish Council fully supported the introduction of speed limits on the Braishfield Road, Common Hill Road and Dores Lane. The Parish Council had sought a limit on Braishfield Road from the top of Cropk Hill

to the junction of Baileys Down Road a point further north than that proposed by the County. In Dores Lane the Parish had sought extending the limit as far as the Pairsh boundary. A limit had not been requested on minor lanes where it was believed that a speed in excess of 30mph could not be attained. On resuming the meeting members gave further consideration to the County Council's proposals for the speed limit.

RESOLVED -

That the County Council be informed that the Parish Council would now withdraw their earlier representations on the extent of the speed limit and concur with the proposals as set \cdot out by the County Council.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

(a) Footway, Braishfield Road

In response to Parish Council concern about the condition of the footway immediately north of Chapel Close the Area Surveyor indicated that he did not consider this section of path to be in an unacceptable condition for public use. Surface treatment would be carried out to footways in Braishfield during the summer which would prevent further deterioration and provide a good surface.

The Chairman referred to a letter from the Footpath Group Leader of this project which had undertaken a survey of footpaths and footways and highlighted improvements or new facilities that could be provided throughout the Ampfield Area. The survey also proposed the
