BRAISHFIELD PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Meeting held at the Village Hall, Braishfield on Tuesday 3rd November 2009

Apologies for absence were received from Andrew Lalonde.

80. <u>MINUTES</u>

AGREED that the Minutes of the Meeting held on 6th October 2009 are signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

81. <u>COUNCILLOR VACANCY</u>

It was agreed unanimously to co-opt Camilla Horton on to the Parish Council. The Declaration of Acceptance of Office form was signed.

82. <u>VILLAGE HALL BOARD</u>

It was agreed that the Clerk proceeds with the inscribing of the honours board by Rod Hoyle at a cost of $\pounds 202.80$.

83. <u>ROMSEY ROAD RUNNERS</u>

A letter of thanks with a cheque for ± 30 has been received from Romsey Road Runners for the use of the Recreation Ground for the finish of the run in the summer.

84. <u>BT TELEPHONE KIOSK</u>

BT has sent a letter inviting the Parish Council to adopt the telephone kiosk at the top of Newport Lane, as well as posting a notice in the kiosk saying it will be closed. BT said that 170 calls were made from the kiosk over twelve months. The Braishfield kiosk was not on the list of closures received last year.

The Clerk was asked to write to BT objecting to the closure and the way in which it has been announced. He is also to ask what the criteria are for closure and to mention the inadequacy of mobile coverage in the village. The Council might review the possible ownership issue depending on the reply received.

c) Recreation Ground trees

Following the 'no objection' from Test Valley Borough Council to the trees along Common Hill Road being pruned, the Clerk was asked to speak to Ian Knight about raising them to a height of eight feet over the public footway and over the school gas tank area.

d) Minerals & Waste Strategy

It was noted that Hampshire County Council intends to start a consultation period on Minerals and Waste Strategy sometime in November.

87. <u>HIGHWAYS AND ROAD SAFETY</u>

a) 30mph signs

It was noted that the twinning sign has been installed but that the illuminated speed sign has gone for repair. The Clerk to Ampfield Parish Council has pointed out to TVBC that it should still be under warranty. The Clerk mentioned that no invoice has been received for the operational costs of the sign from TVBC.

b) Camera signs

The camera signs have not yet been removed but it was noted that they have disappeared from Ampfield.

c) <u>Highway maintenance</u>

It was noted that the potholes in Church Lane have not been repaired.

88. <u>FOOTPATHS</u>

Dorothy Ross again raised the problem of horses using Footpath 9. The Clerk was asked to contact the HCC footpath people again about speaking to Mr Dunn about it.

Nothing has been heard about the repair of the stiles near the Wheatsheaf PH and down near the Crook stream.

89. <u>POND</u>

The Clerk was asked to speak to Ian Knight about raising the tree at the pond to 4-5 ft on the road side, as well as cutting it back from the road, to 6ft on the pond side and cutting back completely over the seats.

90. <u>RECREATION GROUND</u>

a) <u>Playground</u>

Mike Prince gave a report on progress of the playground which is expected to be finished tomorrow. The installation contractor reported that there had been no adverse interference whatsoever with the construction works, which was most unusual at the sites they normally visit.

The matter of the opening of the playground was discussed and it was suggested that it should take place on the day of the School Christmas Fete ie 28th November. Kate Marshall volunteered to contact Justin Edwards to see if he could come, but if not, then Father Christmas at the Fete would probably be able to do the opening instead.

Mike Prince has received an acknowledgement sign from SITA and is awaiting one from Viridor. He will speak to TVBC concerning one from them.

After Kompan has invoiced the Parish Council for the work, copies of the invoice along with the Council's bank details will be sent to the three bodies. The grant money should then be placed into the Council's account so that the invoice can then be paid.

b) Fitness trail

The Council considered the matter of the proposed fitness trail in the light of letters of objection and support being received. The discussion involved the level of use expected and it was felt that the School would make good use of it. It was agreed that the Council would agree to the trail being installed subject to there being a further look at the signs for each fitness station. The Clerk was asked to write to the BVA to this effect and saying that the Council will give support to its grant application.

Mike Prince said he would speak to the School about the trail.
