Many matters have been considered by the Council and I will endeavour to report on them as they arose.

General A.L. Ransome was again elected Chairman and Mr. Cobbold Vice Chairman of the Council

Several matters were referred to the Council from the Parish Weeting and considered :-

Rubbish in the Sand Pit. Owing to the road widening of Road C91 to the Manor the Rubbish in the Sand Pit had been covered down and the pit made more respectable and it was agreed to defer the erection of a Notice Board. The effect of covering the rubbish had been that very little rubbish had since been dumped

The Sanitary Inspector had inspected the site of the Sewage entering the Crook streamand as a result of the action taken the nuisance had ceased.

The Council had represented firstly to the District Council and then the County Council the necessity of a Namow Bridge Sign at Crook Bridge and they had been erected.

The Transfer of the Recreation Ground from the Trustees and to the Council had been completed and the Transfer of funds amounting to £ 12. 17. 1 had been handed over. The Tithe on the Ground had been redeemed at a cost of £ 16.11.8 The hedge around the ground had been cut at a cost of £12. 10. 0 The Council had also by personal contact and with the co-operation of the Parish organisations ask the Parishioneers to respect the use of the ground, as footpaths agross the ground made made it dangerous for organised spots This followeded a Meeting with representatives of the football club.

The use of the Ground by the County Council as a School Playing Fill had been gone into and as a result of representations the County Council had a agreed to make a grant of £ 10 per annum for sach user.

Two Planning Applications had been/achterdings on the Sites and recommendations made to the Planning Authority

Many other matters have been considered and are constantly under review including Roads Footpaths Bus Service and the Pond

I would remind Parishioneers of the forthcoming elections to the Parish Council.
