Mr. Greenwood and Mr. Dummer retired as Members of the Council. Mr. Travis and Mr. Willett were welcome as new members. Mr. Cobbold and Mr. Parsons were elected representatives on the Parish Councils Association and Miss Bacon and Mr. Cobbold School Managers of the Braishfield Primary School.

Many varied items has been considered during the year particularly with regard to the Roads and Bus Services. Bus Services in this year have been extended to the Manor and the Service has been improved and the Councils constant watching and cooperation with the Bus Company has brought these improvements about.

Many suggestions have been made to the Divisional Surveyor to improve the Roads and footpaths.

Another matter that the Council has considered is the nuisance caused by the Rubbish Dump at Carisbrook Common and the Chief Sanitary Inspector promised to deal with the matter.

The County Council Education Committee was paying the sum of £ 10 per annum for the use ~~for~~ of the Recreation Ground for School Playing Field.

The Council had asked the District Council to use the site behind the Post Office for Housing and it was now hoped that building would soon commence.

The Council had supported the County Council in their application to use the land at Farley Mount for the Public.

Mr. Brown had attended most of the Meetings of the Council and his help and cooperation with the Council had been very much appreciated.
